As we wish to prioritise inviting parents into school to watch the infant nativity play in December, it is unlikely that we will be able to hold a Christmas fayre indoors this year. Therefore, the PTFA have decided to organise a large Christmas raffle instead.

Our aim is to produce five magnificent hampers (containing a wide range of items that can be enjoyed by all ages: games, toys, chocolate, other food items, candles, luxury products, etc).

To encourage as many people to donate a prize to go in one of these hampers, we will be having a Non-Uniform Day on Friday 22nd October - in return for the children bringing in a raffle prize.

We are asking all of the children in:

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- Bridge to bring something in that is RED or ORANGE
- Castle to bring in something that is BLUE or PURPLE
- Mersey to bring something that is GREEN or LIME
- Priory to bring something that is YELLOW or GOLD
- Staff & Governors to donate something that is WHITE or SILVER

The items should be new and unopened – and, if they have an expiry date, for this to be on (or after) 26th December 2021.

It would be amazing if everybody could support this fundraising project. Raffle tickets will be on sale from the last week in November and the draw will be made on Friday 17th December (to allow the winners time to collect their prizes).

The PTFA will also be holding a Christmas Surprise Room on Monday 13th December and Tuesday 14th December. For £2.50, the children will be able to enter the surprise room, choose a gift for one, or more, of the adults who take care of them, wrap it and bring it home – as a gift to be opened on Christmas Day.

Previously we have only held Mother's Day and Father's Day Surprise Rooms – and the children have loved taking part in these.

Hopefully this is another way that we can keep the cost of buying presents for family members down – and making the children feel special and proud to buy something for somebody they deeply care about.
